Lloyd and Win Kent Scholarship

This scholarship has been established by the Baptist Union of the Northern Territory to acknowledge the life and ministry of Rev Dr Lloyd Kent and his wife Win. They travelled to Darwin from Melbourne in 1963 with the specific aim of establishing a Baptist Church in Darwin. Not only was this achieved, but Lloyd's vision and energy drove much of the development of Baptist work in the Top End.

Lloyd and Win remained in faithful service throughout their lives, even in retirement. They shared a love for people everywhere, of all cultures. They had a particular fondness for the Aboriginal people of the Top End and formed many significant friendships with them. They were keen for Christian people to have a vibrant and relevant witness and served to help people grow in their knowledge and understanding of God and His Word.

A scholarship to help people learn more about the Bible and Christian ministry is an appropriate memorial to Lloyd and Win. Both were avid scholars of the Bible and were theologically trained. Lloyd completed his PhD in 2001 at the age of 79 – a testament to the principle of life-long-learning.

Applicants for grants from this fund are encouraged to similarly apply themselves to learn the scriptures and apply them in life and ministry according to the gifts God has given.

This form sets out the terms of operation of the Scholarship along with an application form for those wishing to apply.

Lloyd and Win Kent Memorial Fund

1. Applications for financial assistance from the fund may be accepted under the following guidelines:
 - 1.1 Applicants shall be:
 - 1.1.1 accredited and recognized Ministers within the BUNT or those in the process of training towards accreditation, or
 - 1.1.2 others with a particular training or ministry focus.
2. Financial assistance, limited to a maximum of:
 - 2.1 a maximum of \$1,000 per applicant for accredited or recognized Ministers with the BUNT or those in the process of training towards accreditation.
 - 2.2 a maximum of \$500 per applicant for others with a particular training or ministry focus.

The funds should be used towards the costs of theological, biblical or pastoral studies or seminars approved by the BUNT, which will directly benefit the applicant in his/her ministry with the BUNT.

3. Applications for a scholarship will be made on the Application Form and sent to the Secretary of the BUNT prior to the commencement of the relevant seminar or training course.
4. The Application shall include details of the relevant course or seminar and a description of the relevance to the applicant's ministry and how it will directly benefit his or her ministry in the Northern Territory.
5. The scholarship may be used broadly for the purpose of assisting attendance at the course or seminar including for course fees, travel and accommodation where necessary.
6. While a grant may be limited to a maximum as outlined in 2 above it is not intended that scholarship granted will necessarily be the maximum amount, they may be smaller in keeping with the costs of attending the proposed activity.
7. An individual applicant may only apply for one grant in any one calendar year.
8. On completion of the training or course for which the scholarship was awarded a written report is to be provided to the BUNT Assembly Board.
9. The BUNT Assembly Board will, at its discretion, consider each application on its merits.
