

Moving Towards—NT /SA Amalgamation

The journey continues and step by step we are moving toward the amalgamation becoming reality. At the BUNT Assembly on 24 March the motion to proceed with "all necessary steps" to enable amalgamation was overwhelmingly approved. Then more recently, 19 May, the Assembly of Baptist Churches of SA (BCSA) unanimously agreed to similarly "take steps to work towards amalgamation". We thank God for his ongoing leading in this space and for the wonderful sense of affirmation across both the NT and SA churches.

While the vision continues to be of enriched and enhanced support for healthy, vibrant church communities living, proclaiming, and demonstrating the Kingdom of God in our needy and broken world, we recognise there will be a mixture of emotional responses to these changes. All change will bring some element of grief and we want to acknowledge this reality, while continuing to affirm the overwhelming benefit of the amalgamation.

The BUNT/BCSA joint taskforce is now focusing on finalising the proposed amendments to the BCSA constitution that will provide the legal framework for the amalgamated entity. Once this has sufficiently progressed the next step will be for the BUNT Assembly, at an appropriate Assembly meeting later in the year, to take the vote to wind up BUNT Inc. and for member churches to join the new entity. Similarly, the BCSA Assembly will be agreeing to adopt the revised constitution ... it is all a matter of getting the steps lined up appropriately.

Hello Everyone,

hope the Dry Season is treating you well. Certainly for our brothers and sisters in the communities of Daguragu, Pigeon Hole, Kalkarindji and Lajamanu which were hit by flooding and evacuated to Darwin, the dry weather will be very welcome. One blessing was that we had church members from these regions attend Top End churches while they were in Darwin.

Casuarina Baptist Pastors, Mal Good, and his wife Chris Good are now members of the Outback Australia Team with Baptist Mission Australia. There is a real resolve to strengthen connection between all of our Baptist Union Churches as well as our connection with Australian Baptist Ministries, who have had a continued and committed presence in many of our remote Churches. Having Mal and Chris in this position is certainly a blessing.

There has been approval of a new **Child Protection Policy** and this is now in place. The commitment to child protection for our churches is a high priority and one of the strengths of the movement.

In regard to this we have had no claims against the redress scheme put in place due to the Royal Commission into Institutional Child Sexual Abuse. A zoom meeting with the Child Protection Contact Officers to help in understanding changes for the churches and answer any questions around the changes will take place on Tuesday 20th June.

An **Assembly Meeting** was held on the 24th of March to vote on making a formal commitment to the process of winding up as an association in the Northern Territory and amalgamating with the Baptist Churches of South Australia. This was not the vote to wind up, which will take place on a further date once the Baptist Churches of South Australia have passed the constitutional changes necessary. There were nine of the Territory Churches represented at the meeting.

Planning is underway for the **Baptist Family Gathering,** to be held at
Casuarina Baptist in September this year.
I highly recommend that we all commit
to the gathering and come to hear some
high quality speakers.


Mal and Chris Join the Outback Team

They both studied at Vose
Seminary in Perth and have been in pastoral ministry for over sixteen years. They first served in rural WA, then relocated to Darwin's northern suburbs in 2017, where together they pastor the multi-ethnic
Casuarina Baptist church. During this time, they started to connect with several Indigenous believers. They began visiting Kalkarindji and Lajamanu each year to encourage the local believers, who strive to follow Jesus in their own distinctive ways on their traditional land.

In April 2023 Chris and Mal joined Baptist Mission Australia's Outback Australia team part-time, whilst continuing to pastor Casuarina Baptist Church. For several months each year they are walking alongside the primarily Warlpiri believers in Lajamanu.

Mal and Chris consider it a great privilege to be part of this team and a greater privilege to be welcomed into the Indigenous communities.



Both have much to learn in this space, as they want to be good listeners who seek to hear the voice of God, as well as the voices of their Indigenous brothers and sisters. In this amazing mix, may they all seek to hear what the Holy Spirit is saying to the churches.






For Prayer and Praise

Mentoring Senior Youth Toward a Life of Discipleship at Darwin Baptist

n a world where school-aged youth face numerous challenges and questions about their belonging, identity, and purpose, mentoring and discipleship play a crucial role in guiding, equipping, and preparing them for life after year 12. At the recent Scripture Union Leadership Training Day, Steven Miles, Youth Worker Darwin Baptist Church (DBC), and Jayden Ilett, Youth Intern DBC, delivered an interactive case study sharing the successes and surprises of how DBYouth (Darwin Baptist Youth) started an intentional mentoring and discipleship space called SHIELD, with eight Year 12's in 2022.

We are all called to be disciples of Jesus that make disciples.

Matthew 4:19 - "Come, follow me," Jesus said, "and I will send you out to fish for people." Matthew 28:19-20 - "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

<u>According to Jesus, from beginning to end, to be a disciple is to make disciples.</u>

As part of SHIELD our mentors modelled an 'Up In Out' life:

UP - Jesus developed a pattern of prayer and listening to God.Our mentors prayed regularly for their year 12s and prayed with them.

IN - Jesus chose a core community to prioritise and invest in.
 Our mentors committed to supporting and investing into their year 12. This looked very practical, meeting their physical needs, encouraging them,
 Walking through tough times with them.

OUT - Jesus developed a rhythm of being and bringing good news.





Mentors invited their year 12s into their everyday life, and modelled to them how to live out what they are learning in practical and authentic ways.

What was SHIELD exactly?

We created SHIELD to be an intentional space for year 12 youth to grow deeper in their relationship with God, nurture their leadership giftings and be mentored one-on-one over the course of a year by a DBYouth Leader. A key focus over the year was to debunk the myth that you needed to be a mature, wise Christian to disciple another.

The year 12's read the Bible each fortnight using the Discovery Bible Method with their mentor. This taught them that reading the Bible this way is simple, repeatable, and transferrable, which encouraged and enabled them to consider reading the Bible with their friends too.

School Leavers Connect Group.

Many of these year 12's have created a Bible study group in 2023. SHIELD has continued in 2023 with seven new year 12's participating this year!

What did we learn?

We learnt that managing eight young adult mentors is a lot of work. In 2023, we created two new 'Check-in Coordinator' roles, filled by two amazing middle-aged people. These coordinators are tasked with checking in with the young adult mentors once a month and running through the same content of reading the Bible and modelling an 'Up In Out' life to them. Praise God for our willing and able church family!



This includes almost all of the New Testament and some of the Old Testament This PEV has been designed for Aboriginal people whose own language is not English. Bishop Anderson used the PEV in his teaching.

One of the regular highlights of KCC is the celebration nights where groups present Christian songs and dances. Everyone enjoys these evenings of sharing faith through song and dance and they often go on until late in the evening.

Scripture Union has run the Childrens Program at KCC for decades and this year the team of Kylie, Rachel and Johan did a marvellous job keeping the kids engaged and active.

Bishop Greg observed,

"In recent months, there has been considerable media attention given to trouble, violence and crime in the Northern Territory. KCC demonstrates such a different situation, with people from so many different communities and backgrounds coming together peacefully and with real enjoyment in being together, because they have given themselves to Jesus and are trying to live as his followers."



Answers to some of your more common questions...

We are holding a community 'Fun Day' which includes various stalls. Is this covered by our insurance?

Stalls where money is raised solely for the church are generally covered. However, stalls where goods are sold and monies kept by the stall owners are not covered. If you are running a community event, I recommend you give me a call to discuss exactly what is proposed. For some activities, the Insurer would require specific risk management plans in place to ensure cover.

Why doesn't our Personal Accident insurance cover medical expenses that are fully or partially covered by Medicare?

Unfortunately, Section 126 of the Health Act prevents personal accident insurance companies from paying medical expenses which are subject to a full or partial rebate from Medicare, including the Medicare Gap. Due to this Government legislation, Insurers can only pay Non-Medicare Medical Expenses.

Growth and Challenges for Foodbank NT

Food for Life Food Hub Project

With the continuing cost of living pressures making it harder for average Australians to make ends meet, the Baptist Care NT Food for Life program has seen a 500% increase in patronage during the first half of 2023. This increased volume has put significant pressure on our staff and volunteers with customers even queuing prior to the doors opening each Saturday morning. To accentuate the problem even further, corporate donations are down year on year by over 20% meaning we have to do more with less. We wish to thank our amazing volunteers who provide unwavering support for allowing us to continue to provide this important service to the NT community.

Support for Emergency Disaster Relief in the Northern Territory

The Northern Territory is prone to major natural disasters on a regular basis and Baptist Care NT Foodbank program is regularly called upon to provide support during these times. In March 2023, the Daly, Tiwi and Gregory districts experienced severe flooding.

Amid challenging times, Baptist Care's volunteers rallied together to provide food and drinking water to those evacuated to Darwin after the initial flood and delivered over 500 hampers for evacuees returning to their homelands.

Continued Growth of the School Breakfast Program

As part of our ongoing commitment to supporting the community and ensuring the well-being of children, Baptist Care Northern Territory has been actively involved in the Foodbank School Breakfast **Program.** Building upon the success of last year's trial, we are excited to announce the expansion of the School Breakfast Program in the Northern Territory. The positive response and interest from new schools wanting to join the program have been overwhelming. .In the first half of the school year, we onboarded 20 new schools into the program. This expansion will continue into term 4, 2023, with the aim of having a total of 51 schools registered in the program by the end of the year. The increasing number of schools joining the program reflects the significance of our efforts in addressing childhood hunger and promoting well-being within the community.


