While the merger will remove a lot of the administration burden from the Assembly Board, there will remain opportunity and challenge for some of that energy to be directed more deliberately into the fellowship of the Northern Territory churches.

Sadly, **Nhulunbuy Baptist Church** has held its last Sunday service.

They have been meeting monthly and have now decided to close and combine with other congregations in the township. We would like to thank **Davin Blundell** and the leadership of the church for all the effort and work they have put into the running of the church for so many years.

The Outback Team have recently held Bush Training camps for the Christians in the remote communities, which have had great success and have been wonderful times of sharing, teaching, and using spiritual gifts.

Finally I would like to acknowledge the work of **Brod Crook**, husband of Sharon Crook, who passed away earlier this year. While Sharon was the main driver of the Bush Church, known also as The Gathering, in Humpty Doo, Brod was always by her side in the work at the church, including the ministry of provision of food to needy people. The church was a member of the Baptist Union for many years and we extend our sympathy to Sharon and the family, as well as the congregation members.

Please pray for the new season ahead that it may be led by the Holy Spirit and that we would follow his direction.

NT Baptists Step into a New Era

t was a great joy to celebrate 53 years of the ministry of BUNT at the Baptist Family Gathering dinner. It was also a historic occasion, with some sadness, as we marked the end of this chapter, but also with thankfulness for God's faithfulness and the faithfulness of his servants amongst us.

Since 2011, BUNT and BCSA have worked under a Memorandum of Understanding for the support and flourishing of ministry in the Territory. The team in SA has provided support in various ways including accreditation, child protection, and church support. The step of amalgamating to become one Association builds on and brings an even greater intentionality to this.

Since the BUNT Assembly Board initiated discussions around amalgamating in 2021, a taskforce has been meeting regularly to consider the details and practical steps towards an amalgamation. We are grateful for the time and energy they have devoted to this work, and in particular thank Mike Mills for taking on the role of Director of Ministries for BUNT in a voluntary capacity in this season.

We recognise that there are many things we share in common, as well as some differences between the two regions, and we look forward to learning from one another over the coming years.

Once amalgamated, the new Association will be quite diverse, with around 10% indigenous churches and another 10% Burmese churches. Churches in the NT will make up around 15% of the Association, and 25% will be rural and regional churches. This will no doubt bring some challenges, but we are excited about this diversity and how God will teach and form us all as we walk together.

Our shared hope is that amalgamation will empower the NT churches to be further released for mission and ministry as some of the burdens of compliance and administration are lifted. There is also a strongly shared desire for equipping and empowering our indigenous churches, with Baptist Mission Australia keen to partner with us all in this.

In the end, we continue forward with the vision and purpose we have long shared as part of Australia Baptist Ministries. We trust that we will see churches planted and revitalised, leaders raised up for mission and ministry, and many people coming to know Jesus through our local churches as we continue to follow Him and be who He has called us to be.

A Small Church Serving a Big God Katherine Baptist



uring our Sunday Worship service here at Katherine
Baptist Church (KBC), we have been working our way through the book of Ephesians. Ephesians Chapter 6, instructs us to 'put on' and 'take up' the full armour of God. Our struggle is not against ourselves or other people, but against the evil spiritual forces.

This battle then is not a physical one, but a spiritual one fought in the heavenly places. Being able to stand and then to withstand attacks, one is required to put on each part of the armour of God -

Truth, righteousness, the gospel of peace, faith, salvation and the Word of God. This has become so vital, as we seek to do His will in this community.

God has made the way for KBC to share the good news of Jesus Christ in different venues and to different age groups here in Katherine.

Every Thursday afternoon during the school term, from 3pm to 5:30pm, we will run a Christian Kids Club at Clyde Fenton Primary School for children from Transition to Year 6. . Helpers are volunteering not only from our church, but from other churches here in Katherine.

It has been a privilege to also lead a weekly Monday night Bible Study at the Venndale Rehabilitation Centre, 35km south of Katherine. At this Centre, Kalano Community Association Aboriginal Corporation run a 12-week residential program. Pastor Kevin presents a message from the Bible using visual aids along with singing and a prayer time. There is always time for any questions to be answered.

The 12-week Bible Study begins in Genesis- exploring creation and how sin entered the world. It culminates in the Book of Revelation and Christ's return. The residents also have the opportunity to join with us or another congregation on a Sunday for worship.

Our priority is to follow Jesus wherever He leads us and we encourage others to do the same.

He's A Good Good Father

Cross Roads Christian Church

Right now we're experiencing an amazing 'season of encounter' where the Fear of the Lord draws us deeper into His love and presence in a way many of us had only previously read about and prayed for. Beginning on 25 September last year and ongoing to church camp in early June 2023 was a real 'landmark' in the journey. If asked what might have brought us to this place, it would have to be deep repentance, worship, prayer and intercession over an extended season.

When, during worship one Sunday morning, a five year old was brought over by her Mum to tell me about the vision she had just seen, both revealing and confirming what God was doing in our midst, it was really quite remarkable.

Then, two or three weeks later, a seven year old was brought to me during the worship and she said: 'God just spoke to me: He said 'You're standing on Holy ground', the moment had, as when the five year old shared her vision, an incredible depth, re-confirming these were no childish whims.

Asking her to repeat it into a microphone, she did so without a hint of nervousness, then went calmly back to her seat.

There have been times of profound silence where a pin could've been heard dropping on the carpet,

times where the Fear of the Lord was so strong no-one dared move or make a sound. And it's been so good to see and hear children worshipping, arms up in the air, tears running down little faces with expressions reflecting His presence and love. Or adults, on their faces before the Lord in deep repentance, the sound of worship so 'heart-powerful' demons have been 'forced to leave'.

Just to be clear, this is not revival as we generally understand revival; true revival impacts the culture of a city, eventually a whole nation, but as described in the five year olds vision, there is certainly 'something happening'. We're praying this is only the beginning, that we, and many others, may experience increasing levels of the passage from Joel as quoted by Peter on the Day of Pentecost; that it would be fulfilled again in this time, season and nation.

He truly is a Good, Good Father.


We were blessed to have **Rob and Deb Griffiths** – 2 of our mission workers -

Bush Camp at Lajamanu

'Walking in the Footsteps of Big Brother'

Bush Camp is one of the most significant events of the year for Indigenous Leaders and the Outback Team as they gather for several days out bush away from the distractions at home.

This year's Bush Camp in August took place at Sambo Rockhole on the Victoria River about 50 kilometres from Lajamanu. It's a remote location, on Gurindji land, but one with which both Gurindji and Warlpiri people have a strong traditional attachment.

The theme for this year's Bush Camp was 'Walking in the footsteps of Big Brother, that being Jesus. Mal and Chris together with Mat, each shared a session, which explored a particular aspect of the Christian life, as seen through the experiences of Peter. They looked at joy, failure, abundance, restoration, hard times, grace, and God inspired times. All the time being called to Follow Jesus! It is not always easy but certainly worth it.

Yapa input came from Jerry, Lynette, and Annette from Lajamanu, as well as George and Danny from Kalkarindji who shared in language through talking,

drawing and pictures.

Between the sessions there was time for fishing and hunting. The river provided catfish and black bream with the scrub providing bush turkeys. All catches were generously distributed amongst the different family and people groups for roasting over their individual fires each evening. It was so precious to drift off to sleep each night listening to the singing and laughter of our Indigenous friends.

The weekend finished on a highlight with the bantism of a man and his two

Reflecting on the life of Peter, as well as the Camp, Mat says, 'The ups and downs of his journey with Jesus are an encouragement to us as we walk through our own journey with God.

There were also lots of opportunities to share bush tucker and drop in a line and have a good chat. Praise God that this year's event at Sambo Rockhole was an uplifting and encouraging time for all who attended.'

Foodbank News

After more than a decade of working closely with Foodbank Australia, BCNT has reluctantly handed over the reins of our local Foodbank to Foodbank South Australia (FBSA) to manage day to day operations. This with minimal impact to our Food for Life (FFL) program which BCNT still facilitates.

Our CEO the Hon. Peter Chandler shares the following:

It is with a sad heart I need to hang up my hat and move on from my position from BCNT after more than 6 years working as a volunteer, warehouse supervisor, operations manager and leading the organisation over the last few years as CEO and Executive Officer. What a truly remarkable experience it has been where if it wasn't for the genuinely good work the organisation was doing in our community and the tremendous team, including our remarkable volunteers that I have had the pleasure in working with, I doubt I would have been here as long as I have. I've often pondered on the thought that God has a plan for us all, and that his journey for us can take us down strange roads, onto new adventures, some which last a short time, some that last a bit longer...but I think there is a reason for that, and sometimes that reason is you need to be somewhere for as long as you are needed.

As Mal and Chris Good continue to pastor at Casuarina Baptist they are also serving with Baptist Mission Australia in the Lajamanu community where they spend a number of weeks through the year.

There is a blurred line between our role with Baptist Mission Australia and our roles at Casuarina Baptist Church. There are now more opportunities to connect with the Lajamanu people when they are in Darwin for medical, training, and Conferences. There have been some very good conversations taking place as people grapple with life, death, and faith'

Participating in the August Bush Camp with Indigenous believers, Chris and Mal write,



'Particularly meaningful was the Purlapa, a traditional dance based on Galatians 3:26-29, around the campfire on Saturday night. This dance showed clearly that we are all one in Christ Jesus, united in Him, through the cross. (More on the Bush Camp pp 16-17)
